The City of Marion approves 2014-2015 budget

The City of Marion approved a <u>\$5,502,381</u> General Fund budget for the fiscal year 2014-2015 at the City's June Council Meeting. The balanced budget does require a <u>4</u> millage increase. The four mills increase was used to increase the police base salary which hasn't been raised since 2005. Council also approved the Hospitality Tax budget <u>\$315,000</u> for the City of Marion.

Fireworks Ordinance Be safe for the 4th of July


The City of Marion's Fireworks Ordinance states that it is unlawful that for anyone to possess, sell, offer for sale, store, transport, or use within the city, any fireworks that are not classified as ICC Class C "common Fireworks." It is also unlawful to explode or ignite fireworks within 600 feet of a church, hospital, asylum, or public school to explode or ignite fireworks within 75 feet of where fireworks are stored, sold. Or offered for sale; to ignite or discharge any permissible fireworks within or throw the same from any motor vehicle; and to place or throw any ignited fireworks into or at any motor vehicle. No fireworks of any kind shall be used, fired, shot or discharged except; (1) from 5:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. on New Year's Day, (2) 5:00 p.m. to11:00 p.m. during the 4th of July Holidays – July 1st thru July 6th, (3) 5:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. on Memorial Day, (4) 5:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. on Labor Day, (5) 5:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. during the Christmas Holidays – December 23rd thru December 30th and (6) 5:00 p.m. - 1:00 a.m. on New Year's Eve.

Be Careful this 4th of July and all Holidays when handling fireworks!!


CITY OF MARION NEW FLAG
