Employees recognized at City Annual Banquet



The City of Marion Employee Recognition banquet was held on March 18th and several awards were presented including revealing the individual selected as the 2013 Employee of the Year. Mayor Bobby L. Davis stated that this award recognizes one City Employee who has excelled in his or her work in the past year and to him, this announcement is the highlight of the program. A committee is appointed by the Mayor to receive nominations from Department Heads and review the work of each employee nominated. This committee meets to select whom they believe has made the most significant contribution to the city. "Once again a deserving individual was chosen and I wholeheartedly agree with their decision", said the Mayor. The award was presented to Dal Johnson, better known as "Pee Wee" or "Half Pint", who has worked

for the City of Marion since 2006, helping the City to maintain Marion's "pretty little town" reputation. He is tasked with collecting large household items and yard debris from citizens and transporting these items to the landfill. Pee Wee always has a positive attitude towards his responsibilities and a strong work ethic. He was awarded the Mayor's Monthly Beautification Award in September for going above and beyond in helping keep Marion beautiful. He is always ready, willing and able to lend a helping hand and the City is happy to have such an exceptional employee.

In 2007, Billy was named Employee of the Year and followed that up by being named Employee of the Month for January 2012 and May 2013. The City and citizens of Marion will miss his knowledge, expertise and dedication to our recreation program.

The Historic Marion Revitalization Association began its own version of "shop local". Marion's "MOM's Buy Local" is one way to show the locally owned businesses that they have our collective support.

Instead of shopping in Horry or Florence Counties, or some other area, when at all possible, SHOP MARION! Instead of ordering online, BUY LOCAL! Instead of supporting chains, SHOP MARION business owners! MOM's (Merchants of Marion) Buy Local program is designed to keep our locally owned and operated businesses near our back doors. HMRA encourages you to look for ways to support our local merchants.

A national movement advertising the same idea, the 3/50 project, asks shoppers to think about which three local shops they would miss if they were to go out of business. (That's the 3.) Then shoppers are to decide to spend \$50 each month in those businesses. (That's the 50.) According to statistics on the 3/50 website, for every \$100 spent in locally owned and operated stores, \$68 returns to the community. Spending with a national chain only returns \$43 per \$100 spent. The idea of picking three stores and spending \$50 a month in them, and encouraging your friends to do the same makes a positive impact on the local economy. HMRA's "MOM's Buy Local" program is sure to inspire all of us to spend more locally and less elsewhere.
