Councilmember Joseph Frazier Graduates From Municipal Association



Councilmember Joseph Frazier graduated from the Municipal Elected Officials Institute of Government on February 1st. Mr. Frazier received his certificates during the Municipal Association of South Carolina's Hometown Legislative Action Day.

To graduate from the South Carolina Municipal Elected Officials Institute of Government. Participants must complete seven required courses – two daylong session, and five other courses that can be taken inperson through the 110 offices of the Councils of Governments or online.

Established in 1986, the Institute is a program of the Municipal Association of South Carolina that gives municipal officials a strong foundation in the operation of local government. Offered exclusively for graduates of the Municipal Elected Officials Institute of Government, the Association established the Advanced Institute in 2014 to provide elected officials with continuing education through classroom instruction and interaction with experienced peers.

"The Advanced Institute gives mayors and councilmembers an opportunity to explore topics of interest to cities and towns in greater depth," said Miriam Hair, executive director of the Municipal Association.

Officials participate in at least four of six courses to graduate from the Advanced Institute. Course topics include public safety, budgeting, utilities, advocacy, economic development and governance.

The Advanced Institute draws its faculty from South Carolina and across the country including recognized local government leaders, state officials, and college and university faculty.

The Advanced MEO institute's largest class to date graduated 70 mayors and councilmembers during the **Hometown Legislative Action Day** ceremony. To graduate from the Advanced MEO Institute. Participants must complete four of the six courses offered.

Let us let theses individual know we appreciate what they do in keeping our town clean!!



Good Morning... George's Electronics!

Allow me to introduce Mr. George Rogers, lifelong resident of Marion County. He hails from the Fork Community with strong family ties to Marion on the Lambert side of his family. He lives on the old family homestead in Fork dating back to the early 1900's. He nurtures 47 old pecan trees on 3 acres of family land in his leisurely time.

Fortunately for you and me, George doesn't have much leisurely time as he is the sole owner and operator of George's Electronics at 528 N. Main St. in downtown Marion. Got a problem with your electronic device? You need George! With a degree in electronic technology, George has been working in electronics since 1971, back when television sets were monstrous and composed of vacuum tubes. As George ex-





George has noted a few changes in the technology of electronics, although he says that electronics itself is basic electronics just like you learn in school. Whereas, it used to take a full two hands to work on parts of a tv set, it now takes only two fingers to hold a part. Electronic devices are now programmed by computer boards; if the device malfunctions, you simply replace the specific computer board, rather than repair the faulty part.

Should your electronic device become ill, George will diagnosis the problem in one of several ways. First, he will check the power unit. Has it been properly turned on? If so, then he will look for any "obvious" (to him) signs of breakage. He will then assess the product to see if it is working as it should. That being done, George can then advise you of your

options. George also sells phones and service programs. When you need to renew your monthly "minutes" allotment, simply call George and he can have you reconnected in a matter of minutes, saving you the time and hassle of doing it yourself.

For a man who previously owned Marion Electronics in the old Pee Dee Block Building on Jones Ave., and had a staff of several employees, George seems quite at home going it alone now and he will gladly help you navigate your personal electronic device.
