# Council agrees to spend money on improvements

At the July City Council meeting the following capital items and projects were prioritized and approved by city council.

The expenditures will take place over the course of the upcoming fiscal year, which began on July 1.

The city will have the A.C. Tollison Gymnasium roof replaced and repaired and the building will be equipped with air conditioning.

The C.D. Joyner Auditorium will have flashing repaired and sealed.

The city will have its 1999 street

sweeper refurbished and will purchase a 16-foot hydraulic boom mower. Additionally, the sanitation department will get a new truck for towing.

The police department will get a new computer server and several city parks will be getting new playground equipment. The playgrounds at Grice's Recreation Center, Withlacoochee Park and Tilghman Park will be redone and sport new equipment. Total cost of the updating, renovations and new purchases is expected to be around \$540,695.

### Sales tax holiday August 5 –7

Back-to-school shopping has become a little more bearable, thanks to the state's annual Sales Tax Holiday weekend. For the 12th year, sales taxes will not be charged on many items from Friday, Aug. 5 at 12:01 a.m. until the Sunday, Aug. 7 at midnight.

During this popular three-day tax free weekend, the 6 percent state sales and use tax and any applicable local option taxes will be lifted on traditional back-to-school items, including clothing, clothing accessories, shoes, school supplies, computers, printers, blankets, bedspreads and linens, bath cloths, bath towels, bath rugs and mats, shower curtains, pillows and pillow cases.

The sales tax holiday does not apply to jewelry, cosmetics, eyewear, wallets, furniture, or items on layaway.

# Calling all crafters and more! MSM's Farmers Market to add more 'Market'

Since the end of June, Main Street Marion, the Historic Marion Revitalization Association, has been sponsoring and promoting the Farmers Curb Market at the old Coca-Cola Bottling Plant on Bobby Gerald Parkway.

Fruits and vegetables, fish and seafood have been available on Saturdays from 8 a.m.-noon. The effort brings local producers and consumers together downtown. Thanks to Main Street Marion, you don't have to travel far to be able to buy and eat fresher and healthier produce.

And now, on **Saturday, August 6**, the group is adding craftsmen and artisans to the afternoon's line up. Not to be a flea market, Steve Pool, organizer and president of MSM, said anyone and everyone is invited to set up for free from 4-8 p.m. to sell their hand-made goods. **Kate Brown of Conway will perform during the event.** 

The Marion Market is being created to give people who live within a 25-50 mile radius of Marion a place to sell their home-made items. Pool said he is expecting art of all types, jewelry, handmade furniture, and other such items to be on sale. Only DHEC approved food



items will be accepted for sale, he cautioned. Pool said the Market will also have exhibitions, demonstrations and entertainment. Vendors must register with MSM, but there is no fee. Registration can be done the afternoon of the event or by calling 843-423-9918 and arranging to complete the forms.

The Marion Market will be conducted within the fenced area of the old Coca-Cola Bottling plant. The Market Place is expected to continue each Saturday while the Farmers Market is open.

# City getting ready to host Swamp Fox Open, a blind draw tennis tournament in September

The City of Marion Recreation Department is sponsoring the first **Swamp Fox Open,** Blind Draw Tennis Tournament, with finals on Saturday and Sunday on Sept. 17-18 at the Withlacoochee Park tennis courts.

Players can register to play in Singles – Men & Women; Doubles – Men & Women; Juniors – Must be 14 or under. All playing levels are encouraged to participate in the tournament.

Register as an individual or a doubles team and match ups will be determined by random draw. Entries must be received by Friday, Aug. 26 to allow time to set up the draw. Entries received after Aug. 26 will be considered based on the number of entries received and space available.

Early rounds will be played beginning Sept. 3 and championship matches will be played Sept. 17–18.

Entry Fees are:

\$20 registration fee for individuals \$30 registration fee per doubles team \$10 registration fee for Juniors. USTA rules govern play.

All players are expected to uphold their commitment to the tournament and the other players in the tournament by completing all matches.

Players are encouraged to play all matches on the city's new tennis courts at Withlacoochee Park. An alternate

court may be used only if both players agree. Each player (team) supplies an unopened can of yellow USTA approved balls for the match. Winners receive the unopened can of balls.

The winning team must report the match score to the Watsonia Recreation Center before 9 a.m. the morning after the "play by" date.


Coaching is not permitted and spectators may not intercede in any way and a parent or guardian must accompany juniors to their matches. All matches are best two of three sets. A set is completed when one player wins six games by a margin of two games. If the set score reaches 6-6, a seven-point tie-breaker (first to seven by two games) is played to determine the winner of that set.
