Marion Chamber of Commerce 26th Annual Golf Tournament



State Sales tax holiday weekend is set for August 5th – 7th. During the annual Sales Tax Holiday, shoppers will benefit from an exemption of the 6% state sales tax and any applicable local taxes on the purchase clothing, shoes, school supplies, computers, printers, bedding, sheet, washcloths, and towels are tax-free. Not all items are included in the sales tax-free weekend. The tax holiday, however, does not apply to jewelry, cosmetics, eyewear, wallets, watches, furniture, and items for use in a business. 2016-2017 BUSINESS LICENSE RENEWALS ARE NOW DUE

Section 1 of the Business and Professional License Ordinance for the City of Marion, South Carolina requires every person engaged in any calling, business, occupation or profession within the limits of the City of Marion to renew the annual Business License fee and obtain a license.

The City of Marion Business License Renewal Applications were mailed on May 23, 2016. Current Business Licenses expire on June 30, 2016. To obtain a 2016-2017 Business License, a completed renewal application and/or remittance must be received in the City of Marion Business License Department by July 31, 2016 to avoid a penalty. Penalties for late payment will be assessed on August 31, 2016, and will increase each month thereafter.

reading development, stroke, and traumatic brain injuries. Her therapy sessions take place in the school or home environment, or in her office at REMCARE by appointment. Rachel also mentors speech path students completing their clinical internships by allowing them to rotate through her practice.
