## **CITY OF MARION PUBLIC NOTICE**

## 2017-2018 BUSINESS LICENSE RENEWALS ARE NOW DUE

Section 1 of the Business and Professional License Ordinance for the City of Marion, South Carolina requires every person engaged in any calling, business, occupation or profession within the limits of the City of Marion to renew the annual Business License fee and obtain a license.

The City of Marion Business License Renewal Applications were mailed on May 19, 2017, and second notices were mailed on July 17, 2017. All prior year Business Licenses expired on June 30, 2017. To obtain a 2017-2018 Business License, a completed renewal application and/or remittance must be received in the City of Marion Business License Department by July 31, 2017 to avoid a penalty. Penalties for late payment will be assessed at 2% on August 1, 2017, and will increase 10% each month thereafter.

FAILURE TO RECEIVE A RENEWAL NOTICE DOES NOT RELIEVE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE LICENSEE FROM OBTAINING A BUSINESS LICENSE.
