

As we approach the Holidays, it is a good time to review winter and Holiday safety tips: 1) If you display a Christmas tree in a front window, do not put gifts where they are visible from the street. 2) Do not let mail, newspapers and flyers pile up. 3) Have an inside light on a timer. 4) Leave a radio or television on when away. 5) Do not hide a spare door key near the front entrance. Burglars know where to look. Give a key to a trusted neighbor. 6) Do not leave doors or windows unlocked to accommodate extension cords for holiday lighting. 7) Don't post your family name on the mailbox or home. A burglar can call directory assistance to get your phone number and call while out front to confirm that you are away. 8) Do not leave travel plans or details on your answering machine. 9) Do not pile empty boxes on the street signaling to burglars what can be found inside your home. 10) Keep vehicles locked and do not leave valuables inside. 11) Be cautious when driving and be on the lookout for excited children riding new bikes, skateboards, etc.

This has been a difficult few months in the Swamp Fox City. Many in our county are still displaced or without permanent housing. Remember those hardest hit by the storm as you celebrate this season. Happy Holidays from A Team, the group that truly believes "We are our Neighbors' Keepers!"
