The City of Marion will be bustling with things to see and do Feb. 25-27 during Celebrating Gen. Francis Marion Days! For the past two years several groups have worked diligently to present a memorial tribute to the famed Revolutionary War Hero at the foot of the General's statue on Main Street. State legislators have designated the anniversary of Gen. Francis Marion's 10K Mayor's Run-Walk death, Feb. 27, as his Memorial Day. Bobby takes great pride in his work and is always willing to assist in any capacity needed by the City.


The Mayor and Council recognized Bobby Bass for his dedication and significant contributions to the City of Marion at the Jan.11 Council Meeting.



Retire News ... **Reminiscing with city retiree Willie Joe Skipper**

This month the City of Marion has chosen to recognize a retiree that was often described by former Mayor T. Carroll Atkinson, Jr. as a man who went "the second mile" at times to get work completed in the Street Department, Mr. Willie Joe Skipper.

Willie Joe Skipper came to work for the City of Marion in May 1972. In addition to being a qualified heavy equipment operator, he also assumed many other duties in the Street Department. Willie Joe was always willing to do undertake any assigned job,



whether it was marking streets or collecting garbage, spraying for mosquitoes or cleaning storm drains, operating a bull dozier or supervising a group of employees on a project.

Many of his duties involved long, hard hours and often resulted in him being called out at night to take care of such things as cleaning up streets after a storm or some other emergency that required immediate attention.

Willie Joe Skipper was named Employee of the Year in 1980, promoted to Street Department Superintendent in 1990 and retired from employment with the City in December 1998.

Willie Joe Skipper and his wife Pat, who retired from Sara Lee Hosiery in 2002, are both lifelong residents of Marion. The couple has three children, Joey, Norma, and Jo; and four grandchildren.
