# Closing Date for candidate filing is at noon on February 13

The City of Marion General Election for Districts 1, 2 and 4 Council seats will be on Tuesday, April 14th. This year, the state's Voter ID law, requiring voters to have an identification card with a photograph of the voter on it, is in effect. Filing for those people interested in being candidates in the upcoming elections filing in January and closes on Thursday, February 13th at noon. March 14th is the deadline for people to be registered to vote in the April election. To get registered to vote or to find out more about having a proper ID at the polling precincts and to see where you will need to vote visit the Marion County Voter Registration and Election Commission located at 137 Airport Court off East U.S. Highway 76 or call Teresa Moody at 423-8268. Candidates should remember that political signs may only be displayed on private property. City ordinances prohibit the placement of signs on public property, including right of ways. Signs can be claimed by candidates at the Marion Fire Department on Bond Street.

The incumbents are Ralph Atkinson, Ronald Atkinson and Joseph Frazier.
