CITY OF MARION PUBLIC NOTICE

2015-2016 BUSINESS LICENSE RENEWALS ARE NOW DUE

Section 1 of the Business and Professional License Ordinance for the City of Marion, South Carolina requires every person engaged in any calling, business, occupation or profession within the limits of the City of Marion to renew the annual Business License fee and obtain a license.

The City of Marion Business License Renewal Applications are being mailed on May 22, 2015. Current Business Licenses expire on June 30, 2015. To obtain a 2015-2016 Business License, a completed renewal application and/or remittance must be received in the City of Marion Business License Department by July 31, 2015 to avoid a penalty. Penalties for late payment will be assessed on August 1, 2015, and will increase each month thereafter.

FAILURE TO RECEIVE A RENEWAL NOTICE DOES NOT RELIEVE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE LICENSEE FROM OBTAINING A BUSINESS LICENSE. If you have any questions please contact Pam Jones in the Business License Department at 843-423-5961.

Open Burning in the City of Marion

A person shall not kindle or maintain or authorize or authorize to be kindled or maintained any open burning in the City of Marion unless conducted and approved in accordance with Sections 307.10.1 through 307.5 or the City of Marion Ordinance 14-09. Burning will only be permitted when a permit has been obtained from the City of Marion Fire Chief. If anyone is caught burning they could be fined \$1092.50.

Fireworks Ordinance Be safe for the 4th of July

The City of Marion's Fireworks Ordinance states that it is unlawful that for anyone to possess, sell, offer for sale, store, transport, or use within the city, any fireworks that are not classified as ICC Class C "common fireworks." It is also unlawful to explode or ignite fireworks within 600 feet of a church, hospital, asylum, or public school to explode or ignite fireworks within 75 feet of where fireworks are stored, sold. Or offered for sale; to ignite or discharge any permissible fireworks within or throw the same from any motor vehicle; and to place or throw any ignited fireworks into or at any motor vehicle. No fireworks of any kind shall be used, fired, shot or discharged except; (1) from 5:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. on New Year's Day, (2) 5:00 p.m. to11:00 p.m. during the 4th of July Holidays - July 1st thru July 6th, (3) 5:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. on Memorial Day, (4) 5:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. on Labor Day, (5) 5:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. during the Christmas Holidays - December 23rd thru December 30th and (6) 5:00 p.m. - 1:00 a.m. on New Year's Eve.
