#### 2015-2016 BUSINESS LICENSE RENEWALS ARE NOW DUE

Section 1 of the Business and Professional License Ordinance for the City of Marion, South Carolina requires every person engaged in any calling, business, occupation or profession within the limits of the City of Marion to renew the annual Business License fee and obtain a license.

The City of Marion Business License Renewal Applications are being mailed on May 22, 2015. Current Business Licenses expire on June 30, 2015. To obtain a 2015-2016 Business License, a completed renewal application and/or remittance must be received in the City of Marion Business License Department by July 31, 2015 to avoid a penalty. Penalties for late payment will be assessed on August 1, 2015, and will increase each month thereafter.

#### Grass, weeds and overgrown vegetation Ordinances

According to the City's CODE OF ORDINANCES: Section 6-1009.1 through Section 6-1009.6, weeds, or other overgrown vegetation higher than one foot on average is declared to be a nuisance. The ordinance also states that any property owner or occupant of the property that allows the property to serve as a breeding place for trash and litter or as a fire hazard is to be declared a nuisance. Any individual who fails to resolve the issue within 10 days of notice of noncompliance will be guilty of a misdemeanor. The City may remove weeds, overgrown vegetation either by the use of a city crew or designated contractor and the cost will become a lien upon the property and collected in the same manner as municipal taxes. The cost of such action by the city is as follows: \$100 per lot, ½ acre or less; \$175 per lot, ½ acre to 2 acres; \$250 per lot, 2 acres to 5 acres; \$250 per lot, 5 acres and over, plus \$100 per hour; or any contractor costs incurred by the city to correct the nuisance lot in addition to the cost of mailings. If an owner or occupant of a property believes they are unable to pay to have the grass, weeds, or overgrown vegetation removed, he or she may ask the City of Marion for assistance.

A voucher program, administered by a seven-member committee, is available for reviewing requests for assistance by low-income persons.

The City of Marion selected Code Enforcement Officer Dennis Brown as its April 2015 Employee of the Month. Dennis has been employed with the City of Marion since August 2001 and attended the South Carolina Criminal Justice Academy in 2003, when he was awarded Class 3SLE Certification and a certificate of training for Limited Duty Law Enforcement.

As the Code Enforcement Officer, Dennis enforces the City's Municipal Code of Laws by issuing citations and summons as needed. He assists the Marion Police Department in preserving public order, issues citations for illegal parking (fire lanes and handicapped) and enforc-

es animal leash laws and commercial vehicle parking regulations. Dennis also makes sure building permits are issued for construction, checks contractors for business licenses and handles litter complaints.

Tasked with enforcing illegal sign laws, nuisance and abatement, he also oversees the removal of abandoned vehicles

Dennis was recognized for his significant contributions to the City during the May 12th Council Meeting.
