Candidates vying for Mayor, city council seats

Seven candidates have filed for the upcoming Marion general election, set for Tuesday, April 9. Included in this year's election are races for mayor and council seats in Districts 3, 5 and 6.

Mayor Rodney Berry will be seeking reelection and long-time Council Member Bobby Davis will be making his bid for the mayor's seat.

Three candidates are running to occupy the District 3 seat, Emerson Hunt, Pamela McRae and Betty Wright McRae. That seat is held by Betsy Atkinson, who will not seek reelection.

In District 5, incumbent Odessa Gregg will face former council member Jerry Mitchell. Michael Baker will run unopposed in District 6.



Walking trail gets new tree



Chamber recognizes Baxleys, Brady; DEW Director talks about efforts to address state's unemployment needs, especially in Marion County



Saying the recognition was long overdue and a unanimous one by the selection committee, Baxley's Hardware owners Roy Lee, Landis and Scott Baxley were honored as the Small Business Persons of the Year during the Marion Chamber of Commerce's annual meeting in January. Following that presentation, the South Carolina Department of Employment and Workforce (DEW) Director, Major Gen. Abraham J. Turner, USA Retired, discussed the agency's plans to help improve employment opportunities in the state, especially in the Marion area, and how the agency is improving its services to the citizens who come to them for help.

More than 120 people gathered for the meeting, hearing Turner say that often there is a "skills set mix-match" between what a potential employer needs and what a potential employee has. Addition-



ally, Turner, shown at left, told the group, there is a "dire need for us to get businesses, and to help small businesses survive as they

employ most of the state's people..."

Turner said after assuming his role as the leader of the state agency he has tried to turn it into a customer-focused one, "serving those seeking employment more proficiently and efficiently," training employees more frequently and adding a credentialing process. The end result, he said, is that customers will be given the same answers to their questions, state wide. Also, Turner has worked to improve his department's information technology

and added faster self-service kiosks, and more. Turner said his department is also works on cracking down on unemployment fraud, saving the state money. He also conducts monthly business roundtable meetings across the state, meeting with officials to verify needs.

"We're focusing on Marion ... you need it most ... and we're serious about this economic

pause...We must bring all counties forward," he said.



Following Turner's presentation, the 2012 recipient of the Community Service Award, T. Carroll Atkinson III, presented community leader Ashley Brady with the 2013 Community Service Award. That award allows the recipient to make a \$250 donation to the charity of his or her choice. Brady was recognized for his commitment to community service, community leadership, civic participation and involvement through the Chamber and Rotary and other ventures, as well as for his work with the Boy Scouts, Atkinson said.

Chamber President Dianne Herrington took the gavel from outgoing President Alan Zeman and recognition was paid to the retiring Chamber Board members. This is Herrington's second time as president, third on the board, she said. "I was delighted with the attendance at the annual meeting since Gen. Turner has such a positive message for Marion County. As president of the Marion Chamber, I am dedicated to working across all sections of our community to make Marion an even better place to live and work."

"I have enjoyed working with others in the community for the betterment of Marion ..." Zeman said.
