

Councilman Joseph Frazier re-elected to 2nd Term

Joseph Frazier was re-elected as City Councilman for District 4 for another term on April 14th, defeating Lisa Seabrook, Freddy McEachern, and Doris Gerrald. Mr. Frazier received 183 votes, Seabrook -76, McEachern -12 and Gerrald -11. Frazier is a Marion native. He retired from the State of Connecticut Department of Corrections and Marion School District 1 Transportation Department. He believes his experience makes him familiar with their operations and well suited for the position. Frazier said he is concerns for of all residents in District 4. His motto is "I am a man who gets the job done". Also re-elected during the voting were Councilmembers Ralph Atkinson (District 1) and Ronald Atkinson (District 2).


