ith each coming year, technology and innovation

progress at an astounding rate. With limited budgets and the high cost of new technology, cities can be hard pressed to keep up with these changes. In order for our men and women in uniform to keep pace local police departments look to their corporate citizens for support.

Those at American Waste Systems, Inc., (AWS) -- our local garbage company, with its SC Headquarters located on Main St. in Marion -- feel that it is their duty to support those who risk their lives in order to protect our community. On behalf of AWS, Tish Sealey and Leland Parker presented a check for five thousand dollars on Wednesday, July 24, 2013 to Mayor Bobby Davis at City Hall. Those funds will purchase a mobile computer, dash camera, and other mandated peripheral devices for one of the City's police vehicles.

"We are hoping that our small gesture will encourage other businesses in Marion to contribute what they can in strengthening our City" said Jim Heustess, President of American Waste.

The City of Marion is currently seeking to fully equip its 23 cars, 4 sedans, and 1 SUV with on-board computers, dash cameras and tablets in order to meet requirements of South Carolina Code 56-5-2953 (among others). It goes without saying that the City will need the support of others, in addition to grants, in order to accomplish this.

- I will demand that my child treat other players, coaches, officials and spectators with respect.
- I will teach my child that doing one's best is more important than winning.
 - I will offer praise for competing fairly and trying hard.
- I will never ridicule or yell at my child or others for a mistake or losing.

• I will emphasize skill development and practice and de-emphasize games and competition in the lower age groups.

- I will promote the emotional and physical well-being of the athletes.
- I will respect the officials and their authority and the coaches for their decisions.
