VOTE!! Election Set for April 10th

The Board of Education for seats in Districts 1, 3, 4 and 5 will be on Tuesday, **April 10th**. The state's new Voter ID law, requires that each voter has an identification card with a photograph of the voter on it. The last day to register to vote in the April election is **March 11th**. Additionally, political signs may only be displayed on private property. City ordinances prohibit the placement of signs on public property, including the right of way.

Signs picked up for being improperly posted may be collected at the Marion Fire Department on Bond Street and can be claimed by the candidates.
