2018-2019 BUSINESS LICENSE RENEWALS ARE NOW DUE

Section 1 of the Business and Professional License Ordinance for the City of Marion, South Carolina requires every person engaged in any calling, business, occupation or profession within the limits of the City of Marion to renew the annual Business License fee and obtain a license.

The City of Marion Business License Renewal Applications have been mailed out the week of May 21, 2018. Current Business Licenses expire on June 30, 2018. To obtain a 2018-2019 Business License, a completed renewal application and/or remittance must be received in the City of Marion Business License Department by July 31, 2018 to avoid a penalty. Penalties for late payment will be assessed on August 1, 2018, and will increase each month thereafter.

Happy Spring from A-Team. The warm weather and longer days are a clear sign that school will be out soon. Please watch out for kids on bikes and playing. Also watch out for adults taking advantage of the longer daylight hours as well. Of course, vacation time will be just around the corner. I think most of us feel a little concern when leaving our house vacant so I thought I would share tips to keep your home safe while you are away.

- 1) Ask a friend to keep an eye on your home. He or she should come by at least once a day. They can water your plants and bring in the mail. If your car isn't inside a garage, make sure to leave a key in case the car needs to be moved. Also make sure this person has your contact info and itinerary in case of an emergency.
- 2) Do not make mention of your time away on social media, your voice mail or answering machine.
- 3) Speak to the police about your plans so they can pay special attention while on patrol.
- 4) Leave drapes and blinds as you usually would. If they are left open, be sure to move televisions, computers, etc out of sight.
- 5) Do not leave any lights on constantly. Purchase a couple of timers for lamps instead.
- 6) Stop your mail if you have not made arrangements to have a friend take it in. Stop newspaper delivery.
- 7) Unplug your televisions, computers and other electronics and appliances. This will protect them from power surges.
- 8) Remove any keys you have hidden outside.

A DOSE OF PREVENTION: Rx Drug Take Back Day in Marion County

On Saturday, April 28, Trinity Behavioral Care, Sheriff Brian Wallace, Senator Kent Williams, Representative Lucas Atkinson, and Marion County Drug Enforcement Agents gave the public an opportunity to prevent pill abuse and theft by ridding their homes of potentially dangerous expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs.



This initiative addressed a vital public safety and public health issue. Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse, and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are alarmingly high, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration's National Survey on Drug Use and Health shows year after year that the majority of misused and

abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including someone else's medication being stolen from the home medicine cabinet. In addition, Americans are now advised that their usual methods for disposing of unused medicines—flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the trash—both pose potential safety and health hazards.

During the Rx Drug Take Back Day for Marion County in April, we took in <u>35-40 pounds</u> of prescription drugs. However, at ANY TIME, Marion County residents can take their old or unused medications to the Rx Drug Drop Box located inside the Marion County Sheriff's Department.
