Employees and others recognized at City Awards Banquet

The City of Marion hosted its annual Employee Awards Banquet at Woodhaven on Tuesday, March 19th. A delicious meal was served and many door prizes were awarded. A number of employees were recognized for their hard work and dedication to the City of Marion and its citizens.



Mayor Ashley Brady stated that this award recognizes one City Employee who has excelled in his or her work in the past year and is the highest honor of the program. A committee is appointed by the Mayor to receive nominations from Department Heads and review the work of each employee nominated. Personnel and Purchasing Director Elizabeth Gray was honored with the City of Marion's Employee of the Year Award for 2018. This award recognizes one City Employee who has excelled in his or her work during the past year and is the highest honor of the program. Elizabeth started her career with the City of Marion in 2007. She assists the Mayor and City Administrator in planning and coordinating the City's human resource management programs and is the authorized purchasing agent for the City, overseeing the procurement of a variety of supplies, materials, equipment and other services. Elizabeth is responsible for submitting claims and supporting documentation to the City's liability and workers compensation insurance carriers, and after disaster events to FEMA. Elizabeth also administers the City's wellness programs.

She encourages City employees to get fit and healthy and coordinates the Couch to 5K and Biggest Loser Programs. Elizabeth and her husband Jim are residents of Marion County. Jim retired as Marion's Chief of Police in 2015 and is currently employed by the Marion County Coroner's Office and Baxley Hardware. They have four children (Chase, Kendall, Jenny and Catherine) and are members of Union Baptist Church.

Recognized in her absence was Retiree **Cindy Barr.** Captain Cindy Barr was hired by the Marion Police Department in 2000, and retired in 2018. She served as a school resource officer in the City of Marion for eleven years and then served the department as their Community Relations and Training Officer. Captain Barr previously served as a narcotics officer with the Marion County Sheriff's Office and as a corrections officer at the Marion County Detention Center. Barr also attained the rank of Sergeant before getting out of the U.S. Army in 1992.



Public Service Award for outstanding public service to the City of Marion, was presented by Mayor Ashley Brady. The recipient of this award is selected by an Anonymous Commit-

tee. The award honors people who have unselfishly given their time, energy and resources to help better the city. The 2018 Public Service Award was presented to two recipients, the Azalea Garden Club and the Daphne Garden Club. The members of these two organizations volunteer countless hours of hard work towards the beautification of our community. They can often been seen around Marion, working in flower beds and cleaning up litter along roadways they've adopted. They also participate in community events celebrating National Garden Club Week and National Arbor Day. Both clubs were instrumental in cleanup efforts after Hurricane Florence in October 2018, dedicating their time and effort to restoration plans and plantings at the Marion County Courthouse Square.
