

February 7th last day for candidates

The City Council for Districts 1, 2 and 4 will be held on Tuesday, April 9th. Filing for candidates began on Wednesday, Jan. 9th at noon and closes on Friday, Feb. 8th at noon. There is no filing fee. The last day to register to vote in the April election is March 10th and you must live within the Districts. To find out more about having a proper ID to vote, visit the Marion County Voter Registration and Election Commission at 2523 E Hwy 76 or call Teresa Moody at 423-8268.

Additionally, political signs may only be displayed on private property. City ordinances prohibit the placement of signs on public property, including the right of way.

Signs picked up for being improperly posted will be collected and can be claimed by candidates at the Marion Fire Department on Bond Street.
