Police Chief Tony Flowers recognized and presented an award to these officers for their recent heroic lifesaving actions. On April 24, 2024 Sgt. Mack saved the life of an infant that was choking. The infant was present with his family to help celebrate in this presentation. On April 9, 2024 Cpl. Warren saved the life of a teenager that was threatening the life of himself and others with a knife. In addition, Cpl. Warren saved the life of a victim who was hot during a domestic violence situation. Mayor Brady and council expressed their appreciation to these officers on a job well done.

## **▶ Nikki Samuel – Security Street Cameras**

Ms. Nikki Samuels was present to address council regarding the safety of citizens in Marion. She stated that her mom's home on James Court has been hit by gunshots on multiple occasions. She asked security cameras can be installed in the area, and if something can be done to reimburse homeowners for out of pocket expenses for repairs to their home due to the random gunshots. She also asked if a police substation can be placed in the area.

Administrator Alan Ammons stated that lights are currently being installed at Green Street Park, city hall renovations are continuing, and the Smoke Detector Blitz will be held on April 27.
